

Viewing Learning Resources

1. Go to www.pearsonaccess.com
2. Under **Select program** choose MN
3. Once on the homepage you will find **Quick Links**. Under quick links choose **Perspective for Families**
4. On the Perspective homepage, click on a Grade icon under the Math or Language Arts or Science sections.
 - *If you have the Learning Locator Number you can enter it on the right side of the screen. This will give you resources specific to the student's assessment performance.*

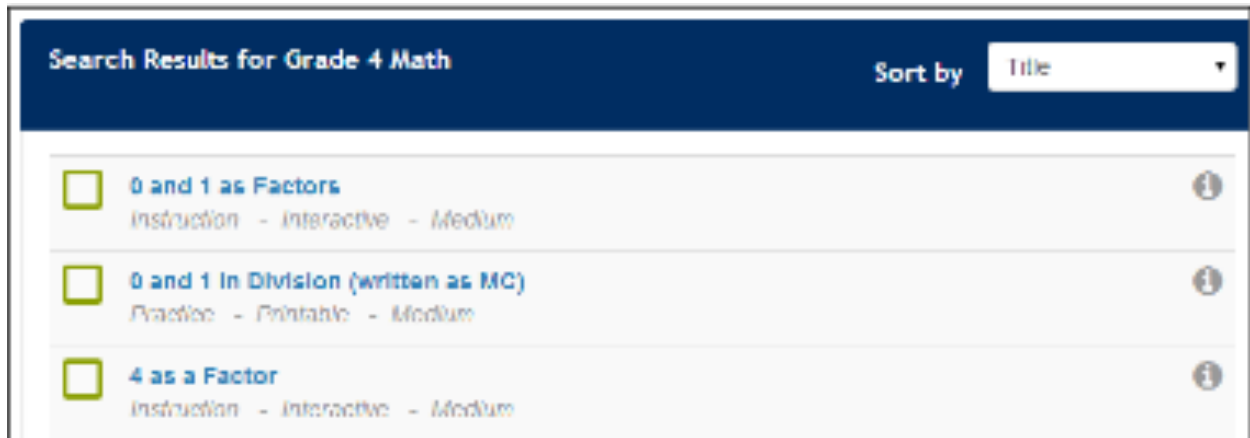
